- Employment or household income impacted by COVID
- Must be eligible for in-state tuition
- Must enroll in an approved eligible program at a Maricopa Community College

- Business, Entrepreneurship and Management
- Computer and Information Technology
- Education
- Health Sciences

This project is designed to assist individuals whose employment or household income was impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. ACP is now enrolling and the project will continue through December 2024.

WHAT'S INCLUDED?

- Career navigation and assessment
- Streamlined admission and enrollment
- Up to \$5,000 for tuition, books, and fees
- Up to \$500 for training-related expenses
- Monthly stipend for the duration of the student's educational program (up to 8 months)

WHO'S ELIGIBLE?
Phoenix residents eligible for in-state tuition (resident for at least one year) who have been impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic under one of the following circumstances since March 2020:

- Household income is reduced due to lost wages or reduced work hours
- Currently or has been unemployed
- Qualified for unemployment or pandemic insurance benefits
- Lost or left off of full-time/hourly job
- Stopped working to care for a sick household member
- Employment assistance
- Stopped working to care for children home from school or daycare

Meet our Key Note Speaker, Jacque Salomon

Jacque Salomon was born and raised on the ancestral lands of the Lenape people (Manhattan, NY) and lives on the home of the Akmal O'dahm and Pipapah people (Phoenix, AZ) where she co-founded Seeds to Inspire Foundation (S2I) (501)(3).

Through a changed lifestyle, she arrested and reversed her Type 2 Diabetes, Hypertension, and GERD, and shed 164 lbs. Realizing the profound power we have over our own health, as well as the autonomy she regained over her own body and well-being, Jacque is determined to bring her story and support to communities most at-risk for future pandemics and climate destabilization.

Jacque is an American College of Lifestyle Medicine (ACLM) Health Equity Achieved through Lifestyle Medicine (HEAL) Initiative Committee Member, collaborator / supporter to Let Our Ancestors Rest Campaign, Founding Board Member of Seeds to Inspire Foundation (S2I) (501)(3), former Pod Advisory Committee Member for PlanPure.com and proud former Community Liaison to Stand Up ASU student club. Jacque received her Certificate in Plant Based Nutrition from the T. Colin Campbell Center for Nutrition Studies (CCNS), is a Certified Conscious Parenting Coach and studied in collective and racialized trauma resilience. She shares her work and healing journey as a Speaker and supports individuals as a Transformational Coach.

Urban Heat Leadership Academy

Building community leaders to reduce urban heat in Phoenix

Phoenix is one of the hottest cities in the world. The summers are getting hotter and lasting longer. However, nature-based solutions, such as increasing tree and shade canopy cover can greatly reduce urban heat. For example, green spaces reduce air temperatures by 1°F (0.6°C) while a shade tree can reduce surface temperatures by an average of 20°F (11.1°C). The goal of the Academy is to build community leaders, as they have the skills, knowledge and contacts for advocating for cooler, healthier and greener communities.
